This webinar is an opportunity for forest communities from Indonesia, Colombia, Paraguay and Peru to share their struggles with a global audience. Activists, civil society organisations and other interested parties are invited to hear from HRDs about the situation on the ground for communities affected by industrial-scale palm oil and soya production. This will be a space for mutual learning on strategies needed to address the collective threats to defenders, with particular focus on palm oil and soya.

The Zero Tolerance Initiative (ZTI), is a global coalition led by indigenous peoples, community representatives and supportive NGOs. It is calling on the Consumer Goods Forum (CGF) and companies to take zero tolerance seriously during and following CGF's week of action.
